# Overview of CGE Africa

Center for Gender Economics in Africa (CGE Africa) is a comprehensive research, advocacy, capacity development, and advisory services nongovernmental organization registered in March 2011. We engage with policymakers, executives, and community people to create innovative solutions for achieving economic equality, advancing work, and creating economic security for women.

We promote the consideration of gender economic inequalities and find out exactly how they can be resolved by people of all genders in the economy. The overall goal is to strengthen institutional support, promote women's access and control to economic activities, and provide general economic well-being for women of all ages.

# 1.2 Program Highlights

01 - Promoting Women's Economic Empowerment through Men's Involvement in Family Planning Service Utilization, with funding support from Pathfinder International.

In Eti Osa LGA communities, we implemented a project promoting men's active involvement in family planning, empowering them in contraceptive decisions, and supporting wives' entrepreneurship. Post-project, the Baale of Igbokusu endorsed our work, recognizing its positive impact on reshaping family planning norms and praising our commitment to community development. A significant outcome includes enhanced women's entrepreneurship and more inclusive household decision-making. Our documentary, "NOW I KNOW," showcases these transformative stories. We also attended national workshops organized by Pathfinder International.



**02 - Promoting Socio-Economic Inclusion of Older Women through Well-being parties in MAIYEGUN and ITEDO Communities, Lagos State,** with funding support from Global Affairs Canada through ActionAid Nigeria.

In 2022, we sustained Senior Women's Associations, fostering social networking and discussions on well-being. Wellbeing Parties and a Toolkit were implemented, addressing various aspects of well-being. Community mobilizers and Party Hostesses were trained for independent facilitation. We investigated gender-based ageism in Nigeria, publishing findings and producing a myth-dispelling mini-documentary titled 'Still Hurts.' This project has transformed older women's lives in Maiyegun and Itedo, fostering health, connectivity, and sustainability through empowered community leaders.



03- Strengthening Women's Capacity for Resource Governance in the Mining Sector: Ogun and Osun State Nigeria, with funding support from the African Centre for Energy Policy (ACEP).

CGE Africa's one-year project in Ogun and Osun states empowered women in mining communities. The training enhanced their understanding of mining sector barriers, risks, and opportunities. The program focused on skills in organizing, advocating, and negotiating for improved Community Development Agreements (CDAs). Participants gained knowledge on self-protection, monitoring mining activities, and engaging with the government for redress and compliance. Specialized training on Gender-Based Violence equipped women to prevent and respond to incidents. The project created safer, inclusive mining communities, evidenced by the enhanced women's capacity for decision-making and advocacy within the sector.



# 04- Empowering Women in Mining Communities in Ebonyi State Through 'Community Coalitions for Livelihoods'.

The project, 'Empowering Women in Mining Communities in Ebonyi State Through 'Community Coalitions for Livelihoods' was initiated to address challenges faced by women in mining communities, including patriarchy and gender-based violence. The objectives aimed at creating a more inclusive environment, increasing women's involvement in decision-making to at least 10%. The project improved women's understanding of Community Development Agreements (CDAs), empowering them to advocate for their needs.

Additionally, it raised awareness of the impacts of mining hazards, addressing gender-based violence exacerbated by the influx of foreign workers and recognizing the vulnerability of women and girls engaged in vending at the mining sites. At the end of the project, we had established women's mining cooperatives in the two communities where we worked.



# 05- Impacting Gender and Nutrition through Innovative Technical Exchange in Agriculture (IGNITE).

IGNITE project aims to bolster African agricultural institutions by integrating nutrition and mainstreaming gender into their operations. We supported enhancing some institutions' capacity to integrate gender and nutrition-sensitive approaches, promote women's empowerment in agriculture, and equitable access to nutritious diets. We represented Tanager for the IGNITE Project as a local service provider in Nigeria.

Other notable activities include a one-week IGNITE Local Service Providers (LSP) Summit in Kenya, a two-day training on Gender and Nutrition, and another week-long IGNITE LSP Summit in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, with CGE Africa team actively participating in all these impactful events. These activities mark significant steps toward transforming agricultural practices for a more inclusive and nutritious future.

# Partnership with Lagos State Ministry of Women's Affairs and Poverty Alleviation (WAPA)

Reflecting on a transformative year, 2022 marked a meaningful collaboration between our organization and the Lagos State Ministry of Women's Affairs and Poverty Alleviation (WAPA).

Waste to Health Workshop: In January, we actively participated in a one-day training workshop organized by WAPA. Themed "Waste to Health: A Tool to Eradicating Poverty," the workshop explored innovative ways for Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) to generate income through waste recycling. This insightful session set the tone for our collaborative journey throughout the year.



Year-Long Partnership with WAPA: Building on the momentum from the workshop, our collaboration with WAPA continued to flourish throughout the year. Through joint efforts and shared goals, we contributed to initiatives to empower women and alleviate poverty within the Lagos community.

Grants-in-Aid Recognition CGE Africa: Africa was honored to be selected as one of the recipients of Grants-in-Aid, recognizing our commitment as a women-focused NGO in Lagos state. This acknowledgment further fueled our dedication to positively impacting the lives of women in the region.

As the year concludes, we thank the Lagos State Ministry of Women's Affairs and Poverty Alleviation for the invaluable partnership. Together, we've taken strides toward creating opportunities, fostering empowerment, and making a lasting difference in women's lives.



Partnership with Rotary Club of Victoria Garden City: Engaged in fruitful discussions with the Rotary Club of Victoria Garden City, District 9110 leaders, exploring the potential for a meaningful partnership focused on the wellbeing and care of older persons. We are poised to make a more significant impact by combining our collective efforts and resources. The coalition is founded and coordinated by the Alliance for Africa (AFA) to work in synergy, stirring up conversations, strategic lobbying, and advocacies to relevant stakeholders aimed at the domestication of the protocol in African union countries and ensuring that the implementation of all the provisions is accessible to all women and girls in Africa.







# Nigeria Feminist Forum (NFF):




This collaboration signifies our commitment to leveraging partnerships with influential coalitions like the NFF to amplify our advocacy and create awareness of critical issues affecting women.


